# FINDING YOUR PLACE IN HISTORY

For many of the Campolindo Varsity Football squad, the Thursday night traditions are cherished as much as game day, maybe more so. At the finish of Thursday practice, the parent crew in charge of team dinners has a buffet style banquet awaiting the team. There is no finer dining in the Moraga area than outside the Campo snack shack on a Thursday night during football season. The dinner is followed by the “shed meeting,” where the complete team squeezes into a building with a large roll-up door that stores the gator (the trainer’s transport vehicle) and all the related field dressings.

The coaches commence the meeting with their chairs positioned in the threshold of the roll-up doorway. Once the coaches finish, they remove themselves, and the players roll down the metal door and proceed with their own meeting. **Coaches Macy and Schofield** are regular presenters. Prior to his retirement, **Coach McCauley** was a player favorite at shed meetings. **Coach Downing** would make occasional appearances and would captivate the players with his spellbinding orations. A collection of other coaches would make cameo appearances to enhance the importance of the event.

Freshman **Coach Nicky Aikawa’s** visits are always anticipated. Nicky brings a player’s perspective for what it means to be in “The Room.” The shed walls and rafters are covered with banners extolling the feats of past championship teams. Memorabilia from many NCS and State championship teams clutter the room. The players are always riveted when Nicky references the past legendary teams and follows up with the challenge “Will your team be able to find space on those walls? Will your team make it into This Room?”

Every Campo team wants to find its place in history. They want to make their marks in “The

Room.” This football season is historic in many facets across the nation. It is the 150th anniversary of college football, the 100th anniversary of the National Football League, the 50th anniversary of Monday Night Football, and locally, it is the 50th anniversary of MOL Flag Football. The stars have lined up for the 2019 season to be a year to remember. The Campolindo Football team has made strides already to find favorable spots in the football history ranks, with the playoffs still to come. This year’s playoff challenges will be the most daunting ever, with NCS dictating that Campo will have to compete with Division 1 schools in Level 2 of the new seven-tiered playoff system.

The 2019 Campo team was blazing a trail for momentous regular season victories with wins over Rancho Cotate and Amador Valley in the Honor Bowl. A peculiar setback with a loss to Acalanes looked to be an event that could derail the season. A few bad breaks in the first half sent a shock wave through the team. The team tightened in the second half as puzzled faces overtook the ranks. The coaches were struggling to connect with a team that was drifting away from each other. A confusing performance had to be dissected. Coach Macy’s assessment was that the lead-up to the Acalanes game saw many players nursing ailments, limiting their ability to fully participate in practice. The team took a cautious approach in limiting contact to the walking wounded. A pattern was developing where players were attempting to nurse themselves during the week of practice in hopes of producing on game day.

Coach Macy’s assessment to the Acalanes autopsy was that players were not coming to practice to get better. Rather, they were only trying to make it to the next game. The prescription to these ailments from the Acalanes loss was to pronounce to the team that all players “practice to get better.” The coaches drove hard, and the players

responded. A demanding week was designed to toughen the players and produce consistency that the coaches could rely on. The doubt that crept into the players' minds needed to be purged from their memories. Even with a solid week of practice, doubt could only be replaced with uncertainty. A test against a challenging opponent was the only conduit to transfer uncertainty to confidence.

As the team started its practice week leading up to Las Lomas, the attention was not on the Knights, but rather, on a Campo team that needed to defeat the demons of the Acalanes loss. The Saturday after the Aca game, Coach Macy saw a studio panel reporting on college football games attempting to assess heavily-favored Wisconsin's loss to Illinois. One commentator pontificated profusely on how devastating the loss was to Wisconsin's future hopes of making it into the four-team college championship playoff system. He proclaimed their year was ruined with no chance of redemption and closed by saying, "And after all this, Wisconsin has to go play heavily-favored Ohio State." A second commentator followed with the analysis, "Thank God they have Ohio State. It's the only way they can save their season." That was exactly what Coach Macy presented to his team on Monday, "Thank God we have Las Lomas."

When Coach Macy got on the bus after the Acalanes loss, he told the players, "Maybe this is what we needed. Maybe people will leave us alone." Earlier that day, Coach Macy saw a Prep2Prep playoff forecast that showed that Campolindo had moved to the number one seed after Clayton

Valley Charter lost a game the previous week. Coach Macy told the team, "We are being set up." Coach Macy believed Campo's name was like an overvalued stock. He knew the team was physically hampered and still in search of an

identity that would produce consistent results. After the Acalanes loss, Prep2Prep downgraded Campo to the number five seed for playoff purposes. If this number stood, Campo would be eliminated from hosting any home playoff games. The Campo stock was being "shorted." Most people took the Acalanes loss as a correction to something that was overvalued. The Campo coaching staff knew otherwise. Limited player participation left the team with an undetermined identity that led to what took place on the Acalanes field.

Las Lomas was the only team that could help Campolindo purge the memories of the Acalanes conundrum. Las Lomas had boasted in many preseason articles how a collection of transfers would take a team that finished 12-1 in 2018 and sat undefeated at 8-0 in 2019 would lead the Knights to a State championship. Las Lomas was highly rated and predicted to handle Campo easily, especially after the Acalanes loss. Las Lomas students sported shirts exulting "the streak." Las Lomas had won 19 straight regular season games entering the match-up with Campo, what was slated to be the marquis match-up to determine the league champion. A large Las Lomas crowd was expected in anticipation of a Knights' victory and the coronation of a new name atop the Diablo Athletic League. With Campo in a precarious spot, onlookers were projecting that it was time to kick dirt on Campo's grave.

When Campolindo fell behind Acalanes early in its game, Coach Macy noticed blank looks overtaking the players' faces. He told the team that there were many years where Campo would trail in games, but the faces never went blank,

they always showed a determination that the game was not lost. However, in the first possession of the Las Lomas game, when one of the Knights' star running backs broke off a long touchdown run, it was a much different





story. The crowd may have been stunned in how quickly Las Lomas scored, but Coach Macy saw in the players' faces that they were not fazed. Hungry to strike back, Campo would immediately respond in its first offensive possession. In just four plays, with the final



being a beautiful pass from **Grant Harper** to **Rex Curtiss**,

Campo was on the board and the Campo crowd was brought back

to life. Coach Macy immediately saw the resolve in the Campo faces that was vacant in the prior week. From that point on, Campolindo's defense would dominate the highly-rated Las Lomas offense and its two star running backs. Campolindo would score 31 unanswered points after the Las Lomas opening score and would not see the Knights score again until 30 seconds remained on the clock. During the practice week, emphasis was placed on utilizing the multiple skills possessed by both **Ryan O'Neil** and **Will Windatt**. Coach Macy also expressed a desire that by game's end versus Las Lomas, it would be clear that Campolindo



possessed the tougher running backs in O'Neil, Windatt and **Brandon Manty**. That was exactly what took place as the three powered through the Las Lomas defense with a determination that sparked the entire team. O'Neil and Windatt combined with **Zach Raphael**, **Joey**

**Schmidt**, **Rex Curtiss**, and **Maxwell Weaver**, to show signs of a receiving core that could be counted on for steady play in the playoffs. Rex has injuries limiting his receiving play in both his junior and senior seasons. Max sat out his sophomore year of football completely. Both Max and Rex are at nine games of varsity experience and are looking ready to blossom down the stretch.

Not only did the defense play with revitalized attitude, it also had to make adjustments for missing linebacker **Charlie Craig**, who was limited with an injury suffered in the Acalanes game. Defensive end **Mason Mastrov** was moved to the middle linebacker position and **Jake Crumbaugh**, who had played sparingly throughout

the year due to injuries, replaced Mason at defensive end. Mason was seen consistently making tackles in



the Las Lomas backfield. Jake Crumbaugh was known as one of Campo's toughest defensive players as a junior, but a broken arm and a severe ankle sprain slowed his progress to return to full strength physically and mentally. At Las Lomas, demands were placed on Jake, and he responded as though he was back to his old self. With Mastrov and Windatt anchoring the middle linebacking positions, it was clear early that Las Lomas coaches would target undersized outside backer **JT Clarke**. They would soon find out that JT played with an intensity that few could match, finding no success in attacking him. **Matai Bell**, **Aydin Mosaddad** and **Elijah Klock** transformed their defensive tackle techniques during the practice week to help prevent any breathing room for the Las Lomas running game. **Jack Daugherty** led a ferocious hitting secondary that saw **Jean-Luc Axelrode**, **Ryan Fritch**, **Walker Rhodes**, and **Tarek McCrea** that got involved in throttling the highly talented Las Lomas

running game. The Campo secondary stymied the Las Lomas passing attack, and it was clear the Knights had nowhere to turn against the tenacious Campolindo defense. On Las Lomas's first play of the game they ran deep route with their number one receiver at Ryan Fritch. Ryan broke up the pass and would continue to blanket the Knights' top receiver for the rest of the evening. What impressed all onlookers was the hard-hitting nature of a Campo defense against Las Lomas' two Division 1 bound running backs.

On the offensive side of the ball, **Jackson Wheeler** was moved from tackle to tight-end to replace Charlie and **Jason Vorhauer** was inserted to start at left guard. Both Jackson and Jason have stories of grit surrounding their progress throughout the season. Jackson was a team captain who was almost lost for the year due to a muscle medical condition and Jason was recovering from a torn patella tendon that occurred in the winter. Both were driving forces in Campo's ability to pound the football with its running game. Solid offensive line play was highlighted in **Matt Koob's** performance, as he spent most of the night matched up against the best player on the Las Lomas defense. With the improved play of the offensive line, which included **Matt Koob, Jason Vorhauer, Lars Ahrens, Elijah Klock, and Matai Bell**, quarterback **Grant Harper** was protected and allowed to dissect the Knights' secondary. Grant was performing at playoff level, and that's exactly what the night felt like, a playoff game.

As the final seconds were winding down, Coach Macy was aware that the loyal Campo students needed to be rewarded for their support.

He walked over to the student section and asked the fans to move higher up in the bleachers to allow room for the team to run up into the stands to celebrate with their classmates.

As the parents surrounded the players kneeling on the field prior to exiting Las Lomas, Coach Macy attempted to explain how proud he was of a team's performance in a high-stakes game after needing to respond from a low point just a week earlier. The coaches in their assessment of the game all believed it was the greatest one-week turnaround during Coach Macy's



24-year tenure at Campolindo. In a year where the nation is celebrating so many football anniversaries, this Campolindo team can now say it found a place in history amongst the football greats. However, with the Acalanes loss still burning in their minds, the players are not ready to let up on their season.

# A MESSAGE FROM COACH MACY

## THE TRICKS ARE OUT FOR HALLOWEEN FOOTBALL

The tradition of a Halloween practice costume party started in 1996, with a varsity team that took it upon themselves to paint their faces in the fashion of what was seen in the movie *Braveheart*. They brought pumpkins to the practice field with hopes of doing fumble recovery drills with the football substitute. Coach Macy took it one step further by



attaching a makeshift sling that held a pumpkin and was tethered to the crossbar of

the goalpost. The sling allowed the pumpkin to swing in the direction of an oncoming player, offering a tackling opportunity where the player attempted to smash the pumpkin with his helmet. It was a Thursday, and in the middle of all the fun, the opposing freshman team was entering the field, witnessing the madness of all the pumpkin smashing. The opponent just happened to be Acalanes and they assumed that the playful activity was meant to be an intimidation ploy by the Campolindo Varsity team. As the Acalanes freshmen coaches started yelling at the varsity kids, it was clear that a Halloween tradition had been born.

Pumpkin smashing was eliminated from football practice decades ago, but the ceremony of celebrating Halloween during practice has grown into a highly anticipated

part of the football season. During the early years, most players adorned jerseys from their favorite NFL player or college team. There was then a shift towards store bought Halloween costumes, and as traditions grow, expectations elevate, and each varsity team has attempted to outdo the prior year. The players are very creative about playing off elements of the football program, especially having fun with any comment coming from Coach Macy. A simple example of this was in 2016 where running back **Matty Rinquist** suffered an early season sprained ankle. Upon his return, Coach Macy wanted to ensure that Matty would not be put into a position to reaggravate his ankle. He made the joke that Matty should be wrapped in bubble wrap during practice to keep him safe. Well, as you can guess, Matty showed up for Halloween practice looking like a bubble wrap mummy.

With the early start of last year's season, Halloween fell during the first week of the playoffs. A group of freshmen had been pulled up for the playoffs, and surprised the varsity team when they presented a choreographed dance routine to music being played over the stadium PA system. So impressed were all the varsity players, that it was believed the freshmen practiced for weeks to pull off the routine. It was stunning enough to see how audacious first comers to Halloween would insert themselves at such a high level. Their



exploits may never be matched again.

The 2019 Halloween practice falls on a Thursday before the Miramonte game. The coaching staff never hesitated when it came to keeping the tradition in place, even though it may have fallen on a risky day before a game against a historic rival. The Campolindo program lives off its traditions, and its traditions bring passion to the program. The Thursday practice will highlight the team's competitiveness to outdo the costumes from the prior year, and will spur a jolt of energy into the team's last practice of the regular season.
